## **ORDINANCE NO. 2006-03**

AN INTERIM URGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AMERICAN CANYON PLACING A MORATORIUM ON THE CONVERSION OF ANY MOBILEHOME PARK CURRENTLY EXISTING IN THE CITY FROM A PARK OCCUPIED PRIMARILY OR EXCLUSIVELY BY RESIDENTS OVER THE AGE OF 55 YEARS (SENIOR RESIDENTS) TO A MOBILEHOME PARK ALLOWING RESIDENTS OF ALL AGES

WHEREAS, the lack of affordable housing options in the City of American Canyon and the County of Napa continues to create a serious problem for senior citizens living in the City of American Canyon; and,

WHEREAS, one of the few affordable housing options left to senior citizens exist in mobilehome parks that permit exclusive residence by those individuals over the age of 55 years; and,

WHEREAS, at least one mobilehome park within the City of American Canyon has recently announced intended plans to convert from a "seniors only" mobilehome park to a park allowing residents of all ages, thereby reducing the number of affordable housing units available to those over the age of 55; and,

WHEREAS, such a conversation may unduly burden and irreparably harm senior citizens within the community and reduce the number of existing affordable units; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of American Canyon has determined that an urgency ordinance is necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of American Canyon.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** the City Council of the City of American Canyon does ordain as follows:

**SECTION 1:** <u>Moratorium</u>. In order to protect the public health, safety and welfare and pursuant to the provisions of Government Code section 65858, a moratorium is hereby placed on the following:

The conversion of any mobilehome park currently in existence in the City of American Canyon from a park where at least seventy percent (70%) of the full-time residents are individuals aged fifty-five years (55) and older (a "seniors only" mobilehome park) to a mobilehome park accepting all ages of residents.

**SECTION 2.** <u>Declaration of Urgency</u>. This urgency is based on the following facts:

- a. There is a current and immediate threat to the public health, safety and welfare arising from the lack of affordable housing options for senior citizens age 55 and older in and around the City.
- b. Article XI, Section 7 of the California Constitution authorizes cities to adopt local police, sanitary, and other ordinances not in conflict with general laws.
- c. The California Legislature has authorized cities to provide zoning for "senior only" mobile home parks pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 18300 and applicable law.
- d. The California Attorney General has opined that such senior only zoning does not conflict with the general prohibition against discrimination based upon age contained in California Government Code section 65008. 87 Cal. Ops. Atty. Gen. 148 (Oct. 20, 2004).
- e. The City of American Canyon currently does not have a "senior only" mobilehome park zoning ordinances in place, but such a zoning ordinance may be needed in the immediate future to preserve the few affordable housing options left to our senior citizens.
- f. The City of American Canyon requires time to study and decide:
  - 1. If such an ordinance is necessary to protect the public, health, safety and welfare and provide adequate affordable local housing for senior citizens.
  - 2. If such an ordinance would have any adverse effects upon the general housing market and particularly the general affordable housing market in the City of American Canyon.

**SECTION 3.** Exceptions. This ordinance shall not apply to any undeveloped parcels of land or to any mobilehome park as may be exempted by a majority vote of the City Council during the term of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 4.** Planning Department. The Interim Planning Director is directed to provide a written report to the City Council at least ten days prior to the expiration of this ordinance, describing the study conducted of the local housing conditions that led to the adoption of this ordinance.

**SECTION 5.** <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the date of its adoption pursuant to Government Code section 65858.

**SECTION 6.** Expiration. This moratorium shall be of no further force or effect upon the expiration of forty-five (45) days from the date of adoption, unless extended in accordance with the provisions Government Code section 65858.

SECTION 7. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and adopted this Ordinance and each section, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared invalid or unconstitutional.
